FROM 'IDEA' TO 'RULE OF LAW'

Phases of the Legislative Process:

- **Phase 1: Policy Development**
 - Identification of a need to create or amend an Act
 - Drafting the legislative proposal
- **Phase 2: Drafting the Legislation**
 - Provision of drafting instructions for legislative drafter
 - Creation of a Bill
- **Phase 3: Enactment of Law**
 - Approval of the Bill by the Legislative Assembly



VIVA LA DEVOLUTION

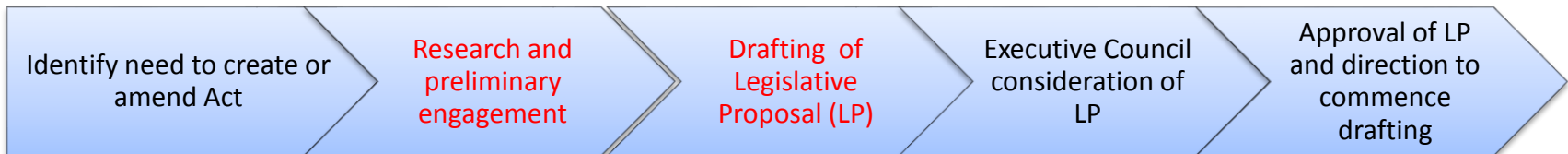
Devolution Agreement, 2014

- Creation of Intergovernmental Council (“IGC”)
- The IGC is made up of the GNWT and nine Indigenous governments, namely:
 - Inuvialuit Regional Corporation
 - Northwest Territory Métis Nation
 - Sahtu Secretariat Incorporated
 - Gwich’in Tribal Council
 - Tłı̨chǫ Government
 - Acho Dene Koe First Nation
 - Salt River First Nation
 - Denínu Kúé First Nation
 - Kátł’odeeche First Nation

Two of the territory’s Indigenous governments (the Akaitcho Dene and Dehcho First Nations) have not signed on to Devolution and are not a part of the IGC

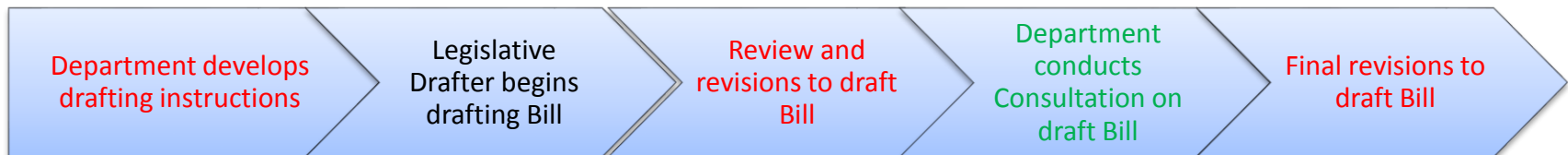
